Job Skills Training Workshop

July 29, 2025 | San Antonio State Supported Living Center

The Texas Beacons of Excellence (TBE) Project hosted a Job Skills Training Workshop in collaboration with the San Antonio SSLC. The event brought together members of the vocational team and newly appointed job coaches, all dedicated to advancing residents toward Competitive Integrated Employment (CIE).

The course, led by Peggy Schmidt and Dr. Paula Dean-Fuller from UNT WISE, provided an in-depth overview of Supported Employment. Key topics included career discovery, job analysis, and best practices for job skills training.

Participants engaged in hands-on exercises such as writing case notes, exploring accommodation options, and role-playing employer interactions. Staff reported that the role-play activities were particularly valuable—enhancing their confidence and preparing them to apply these strategies in real community settings.

Training Spotlight: "On the Demand Side" September 11-12, 2025

TBE Employment Specialists and SSLC Vocational Team staff attended the training "On the Demand Side: Tried and True Employer Engagement Approaches."

This session highlighted effective employer engagement strategies that connect the skills of individuals with disabilities to high-demand workforce needs. The training emphasized the important role of employment specialists and disability advocates as part of the human resource pipeline, bridging the gap between employers and a talented, often underutilized, labor force.

VCU Consultation & Worksite Assessment

August 20, 2025 | Lubbock SSLC & Glassy Alley Art Studio

The Community Rehabilitation Provider (CRP), EmpowerAble Skills, coordinated a worksite assessment with Glassy Alley Art Studio, supported by Lubbock SSLC Vocational Staff, who arranged transportation for residents. Consultants



Austin Miller and Vicki Brooke from Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU) visited to provide technical assistance with the TBE caseload. Employment Specialists Hailey Venner and Prudence Venner designed the assessment to explore a variety of transferable employment skills—benefiting not only residents interested in art but also those developing broader workplace competencies.

At Glassy Alley, residents participated in a variety of tasks, including:

- · Organizing and preparing art supplies
- · Sorting glass for mosaic kits
- · Assisting with studio setup and cleanup
- Following safety protocols
- Supporting art classes and retail operations

These experiences allowed the Lubbock SSLC Vocational Staff to also observe critical employment-related abilities such as attention to detail, adaptability, time management, fine motor coordination, and social communication—skills that are highly applicable across many work settings.

September 15, 2025 | San Antonio SSLC

In San Antonio, Dr. Carol Schall and Dr. Lauren Avellone from VCU provided additional technical assistance to support career discovery and exploration with our TBE participants.

Partnering with Let's Go Texas, a Community Rehabilitation Provider (CRP), the SSLC Vocational Team coordinated two engaging community worksite tours—at Bubble Bath Car Wash and La Gloria's Mexican Restaurant. The tours offered residents valuable exposure to real-world employment opportunities.

At La Gloria's, the restaurant manager shared the establishment's history and cultural background, inspiring several residents to express interest in applying for jobs on the spot.





At Bubble Bath Car Wash, participants learned about cleaning processes and assisted in restocking supplies.

The enthusiasm and curiosity displayed throughout the day marked a successful milestone in each participant's career discovery journey.
